INTRODUCTION

At the end of 2022, the estimated number of international migrants in the world was 281 million.¹ This figure has grown steadily and twice as fast (+62%) as the world population (+30%), since the beginning of the century.²

In the last three years, the number of refugees in the world has grown by more than 10 million. There were 26.4 million refugees at the end of 2020 and more than 36.4 million as of mid-2023.³

About 20 % of these refugees are in the European Union (EU): 7.3 million including the approximately 5 million people displaced from Ukraine. A similar number is dispersed in Africa (7.7 million) and twice as many people are displaced in Asia (about 15 million). Yet, in the last three years, the EU saw the highest relative increase in the number of refugees, with +173 % compared to +9 % in Africa and +27 % in Asia.

The number of residence permits issued by the EU Member States has grown continuously over the last ten years, with a small inflection in 2020 and 2021 due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The number of residence permits issued in the EU in 2022 was 3.4 million, more than two times the 1.6 million issued ten years before in 2013.⁴ About 27 % of the 6.4 million new residence permits were issued in 2021 and 2022 to Ukrainian (20 %) and Belarusian citizens (7 %). Most new residence permits issued in 2022 were for work-related reasons; yet the highest increase was in the number of permits issued for International Protection (about 400 thousand in 2022), that almost reached the record numbers of 2016 (470 thousand) and 2017 (430 thousand) following the war in Syria.

In 2022, Poland issued the highest number of first residence permits to non-EU citizens (700 264), accounting for 20 % of the total number of permits issued in the EU. It was followed by Germany (538 690 - 16 % of total EU permits), Spain (457 412 - 13 %), Italy (337 788 - 10 %) and France (324 200 - 9 %). Together, these five Member States accounted for more than 68 % of all first residence permits issued in the EU that year.

In relative terms, Malta and Cyprus issued the highest number of new permits with 73 and 43 new permits per

thousand inhabitants respectively; Poland (19), Ireland (17) and Slovenia (16) follow.

At the end of 2022, there were about 23 million valid residence permits in the 27 EU Member States (considering permits of all lengths), together with 12.5 million long-term permits in course of validity. The issuance of both types of permits has increased steadily over the last ten years, valid ones by +37 % (or +6.2 million) and long-term ones doubling with respect to 2013.⁵

After a sharp drop in 2020 and 2021 mainly due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the number of visa applications in the EU picked up again in 2022 with about 7.4 million applications but remained significantly below the pre-pandemic number of 16.6 million applications in 2019.⁶

Moreover, the year 2022 saw a record high in the number of first asylum applications in the EU (about 885 thousand), with the exception of the two peaks reached in 2015 (1.22 million) and 2016 (1.17 million) following the intensification of the Syrian war. The numbers for 2023 are expected to exceed those of 2022, as the sum of applications submitted by end of August 2023 (648 thousand applications) surpassed that of the same eight months in 2022 (509 thousand applications).

Six nationalities account for more than half of the total applications made in the EU Member States during the first eight months of 2023: Syria 16 %, Afghanistan 10 %, Venezuela, Türkiye and Colombia 7 %, and Bangladesh 4 %.⁷

As Russia's war on Ukraine persists, people who fled the war to the EU continue to benefit from Temporary Protection. As of September 2023, nearly 4.2 million beneficiaries resided in the EU, mainly in Germany (29 %), Poland (23 %) and Czechia (9 %).⁸

In 2022, 420 thousand non-EU citizens were ordered to leave an EU Member State and almost 78 thousand were returned to their country or to a third country.⁹ This marked an increase after a drop in returns in 2020 and 2021. Both the number of people ordered to leave and those returned to their or to a third country continued to grow in the

HOW TO READ

This section provides a two-page migration profile for each of the 27 EU Member States (MSs) and the EU.

Charts are organised in thematic parts. More detailed information is available in the [Technical Notes](#) at the end of this section.

Data refers to 2022. Whenever 2022 data is not available from the original source, latest available values are provided. If there is no data the corresponding field is either missing or indicated as 'N/A'.

Note that in some cases, the sum of percentages or of individual values might not add up to 100 or to the total value. This is due to rounding and confidence intervals applied by the source.

OVERVIEW [at 1st January] (Eurostat)

Population - 2022 (in thousands)

The donut chart shows the number of people residing in the MS by broad group of citizenship. The groups are 'nationals', 'EU mobile', 'non-EU' (which includes also 'Stateless' and 'Unknown'). The total population of the country is in the centre.

Annual flows - 2021 (in thousands)

The two bar charts show the scale of migration to and from the MS. The left bar shows the number of people who have immigrated to the MS over the last year. 'within EU' immigration refers to people who are citizens of other EU MSs. 'outside EU' immigration refers to non-EU citizens.

The right bar shows the number of people who have emigrated from the MS over the last year, moving to another MS ('within EU') or to a non-EU country/territory ('outside EU'). The total numbers of immigrants and emigrants are on the top of each respective bar.

ASYLUM (Eurostat)

First time applications

The chart shows the number of people who have made a first application for asylum in the MS during a year. The data covers the last years and is broken down by sex. The total annual figure is shown on the right.

First instance decisions

The chart shows the distribution of decisions on first asylum applications in the MS by outcome: 'Geneva' for 'Geneva convention status'; 'Subsid.' for 'Subsidiary protection'; 'Human.' for 'Humanitarian protection'; and 'Reject.' for 'Rejected application'. The total number of decisions on first applications for asylum during a year is shown on the right.

NATURALISATION (Eurostat)

Foreign citizens who have acquired citizenship during the year

Each of the pie charts, together with the relative number on the bottom, shows how many people from other countries and territories have acquired the citizenship of the MS per year. The data is broken down into (a) people whose previous citizenship was of another MS ('EU mobile') and (b) people whose previous citizenship was of a 'non-EU' country/territory (including both 'Stateless' and 'Unknown').

DEMOGRAPHY [at 1st January] (Eurostat)

Population pyramid - 2022 (in thousand)

The chart shows the demographic composition of the population in the MS. It indicates the number of people by age group, sex (males and females) and broad group of citizenship (shown from the outside to the inside of the pyramid), specifically 'nationals' (citizens of the MS), 'EU mobile' (citizens of the other 26 MSs) and 'non-EU' citizens (which includes also 'Stateless' and 'Unknown'). The original Eurostat data is organised in five-year cohorts and has been aggregated to obtain ten-year cohorts. The data refers to the population as of 1st January.

SCHENGEN VISAS (HOME)

Visas applied for, issued and not issued (in thousands)

Each donut chart shows the percentage of Schengen visas issued and not issued per year. The number in the centre shows the total number of visas applied for during each year.

The figure refers to the sum of uniform visas (including MEVs), LTVs, and ATVs. For detailed description, see Technical Notes.

Note that for Romania, Bulgaria & Croatia the data on LTV visas is missing.

RESIDENCE PERMITS (Eurostat)

First residence permits issued during the year

The chart shows the number of people who have received a particular residence permit for the first time during a year, for the last four years (annual flow of resident permits). The reasons for issuing permits are 'Work', 'Family', 'Education' or 'Other' (which includes international protection).

Valid residence permits at the end of the year

The chart shows the number of migrants residing in the MS with different types of residence permits and with permits that are valid for at least five years (national and EU long term residence permits). This shows the total number of permits held by people in the country at the end of the 2022 (the migrant stock). The reasons for valid permits are the same listed above.

IRREGULAR MIGRATION (Eurostat)

Persons ordered to leave, persons returned and return rate

The bar shows the number of people who have been 'Ordered to leave' the MS and the circle shows those 'Returned to a third country/territory' following an order to leave per year.

Return rate

The return rate on the right is calculated as the ratio between the number of people returned to a third country/territory following an order to leave and the people who received an order to leave. Since it is calculated on annual data, it might result higher than 100%, because of administrative backlogs.

SOCIAL INCLUSION (Eurostat)

Each of the pie charts, together with the relative number, shows how many people from other countries and territories have acquired the citizenship of the MS per year. The data is broken down into (a) people whose previous citizenship was of another MS ('EU Mobile') and (b) people whose previous citizenship was of a 'Non-EU' country/territory (including both 'Stateless' and 'Unknown'). [Median equivalised net income \(18+\) 2022 \[EUR\]](#) shows differences in income levels for adults by broad group of citizenship. The values are in euro.

[Household overcrowding rate \(18+\) 2022 \[%\]](#) shows the percentage of adults by broad group of citizenship who live in a household defined as 'overcrowded'.

[Persons at risk of poverty or social exclusion \(18+\) 2022 \[%\]](#) shows the percentage of adults by broad group of citizenship who are either at risk of poverty, face serious material deprivation or live in a household defined as having a 'very low work intensity'.

[At risk of poverty rate for children 2022 \[%\]](#) indicates the percentage of people under 18 (by citizenship of their parents: Nationals vs Non-Nationals) who are defined as being 'at risk of poverty'.

EDUCATION (Eurostat)

The three charts show differences in educational attainment and participation in education by broad group of citizenship: 'nationals', 'EU mobile' and 'non-EU'.

[Population \(25-64\) by educational attainment 2022 \[%\]](#) refers to the proportion of people aged between 25 and 64 by their education level. 'LOW (lev 0-2)' refers to Less than primary, primary and lower secondary education; 'MEDIUM (lev 3-4)' refers to Upper secondary and post-secondary, non-tertiary, education, and 'HIGH (lev 5-8)' refers to Tertiary education.

[NEET \(18-24\) 2022 \[%\]](#) shows the proportion of people aged between 18 and 24 who are 'Neither Employed nor in Education or Training' in the four weeks preceding the survey.

[Early school leavers \(18-24\) 2022 \[%\]](#) shows the proportion of people aged between 18 and 24 which has completed no more than lower secondary education and is not involved in further education or training.

LABOUR MARKET (Eurostat)

The four charts present employment and unemployment related indicators by broad group of citizenship ('nationals', 'EU mobile' and 'non-EU') and sex. Three charts show also a breakdown by age group, whereas the fourth one by education attainment. This section shows similarities and differences in integration of these subgroups in the labour market.

[Employment rate 2022 by age group and sex \[%\]](#) shows the percentage of the total working-age population which is employed within each age group.

[Employment rate 2022 by educational attainment and sex \[%\]](#) shows employment rates of working-age population (15-64 years old) by level of educational attainment. 'LOW' refers to Less than primary, primary and lower secondary education; 'MEDIUM' refers to Upper secondary and post-secondary, non-tertiary, education, and 'HIGH' refers to Tertiary education.

[Unemployment rate 2022 by age group and sex \[%\]](#) indicates the percentage of unemployed people in the labour force. It is calculated as the ratio between the unemployed population and the sum of employed and unemployed population within the same group.

[Long term unemployment rate 2022 by age group and sex \[%\]](#) refers to people who have been unemployed for more than one year. It is calculated as the proportion of the total unemployed population within each group which has been unemployed for more than one year.

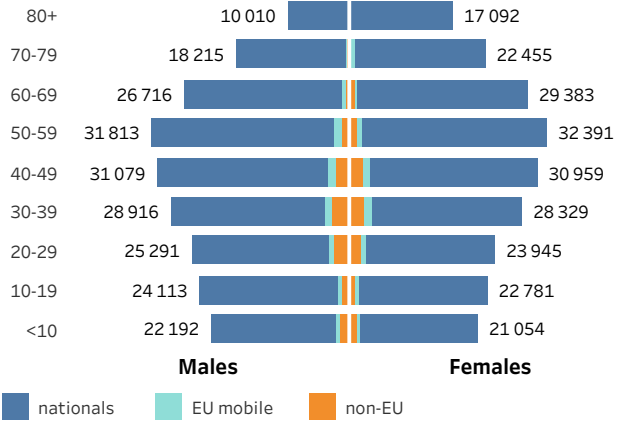

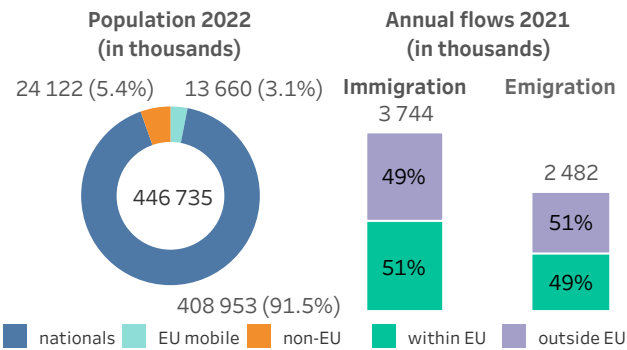

Population structure 2022 (in thousands)

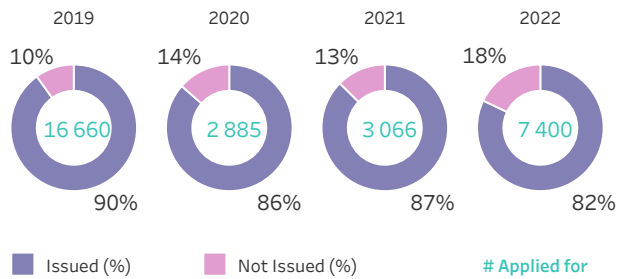

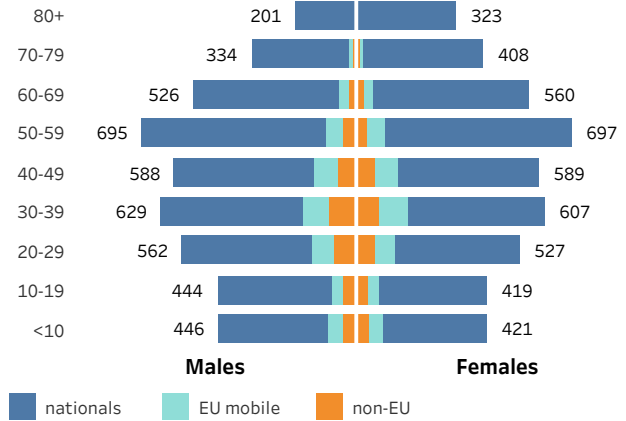

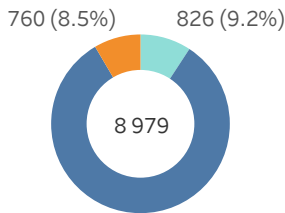

Population structure 2022 (in thousands)

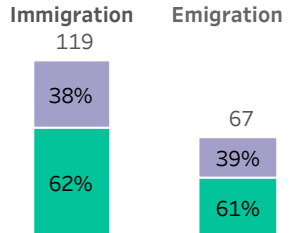

Population 2022 (in thousands)

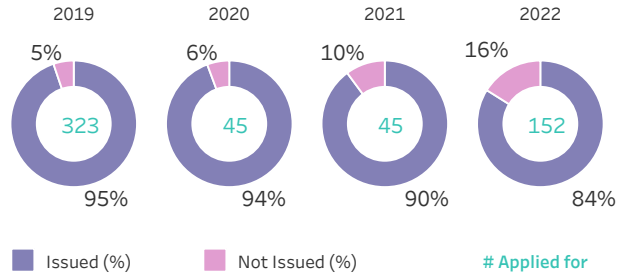


Annual flows 2021 (in thousands)



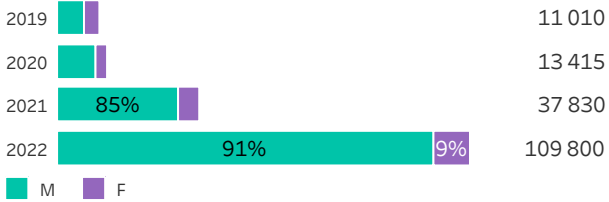

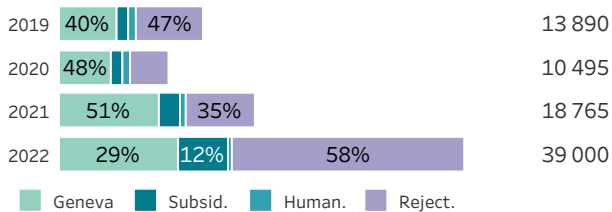

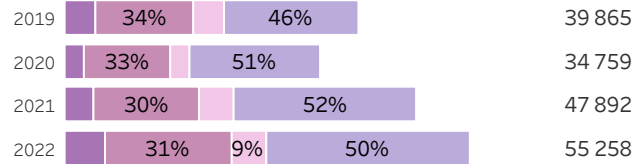

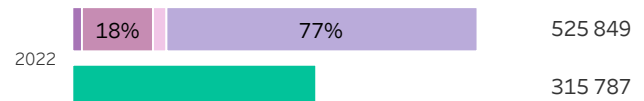

First residence permits issued during the year

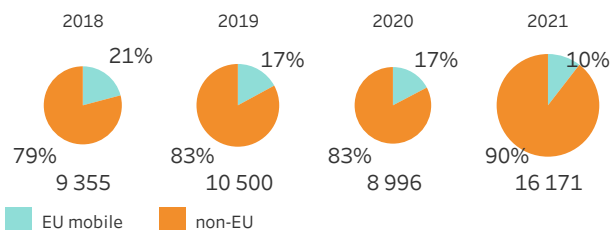


Valid residence permits at the end of the year



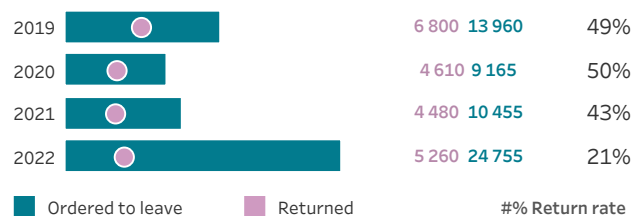

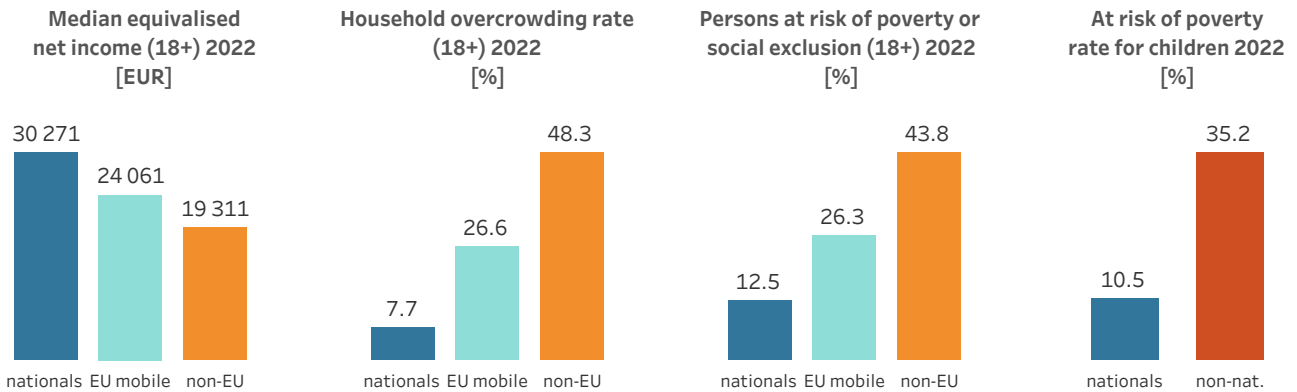

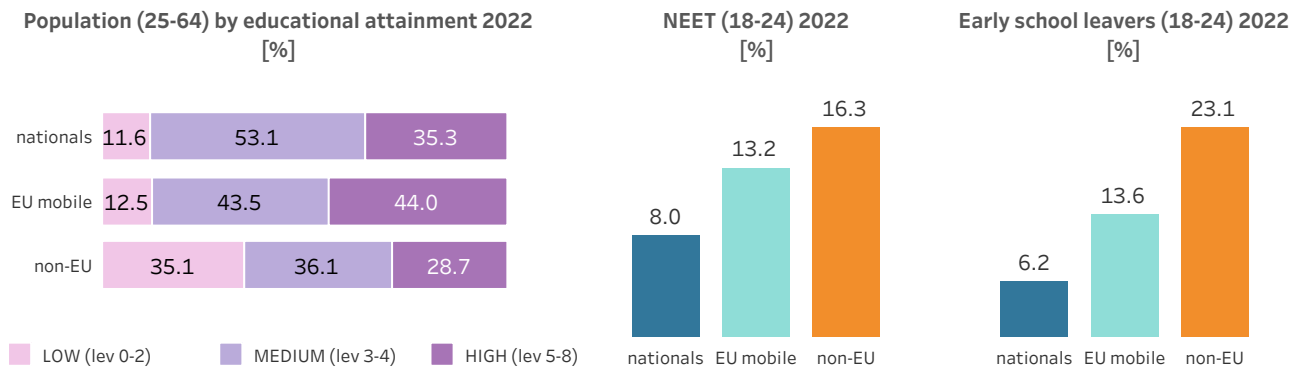

Population structure 2022 (in thousands)

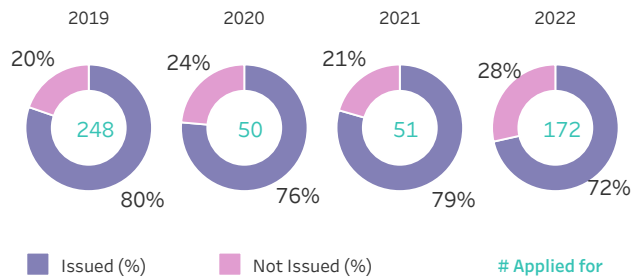

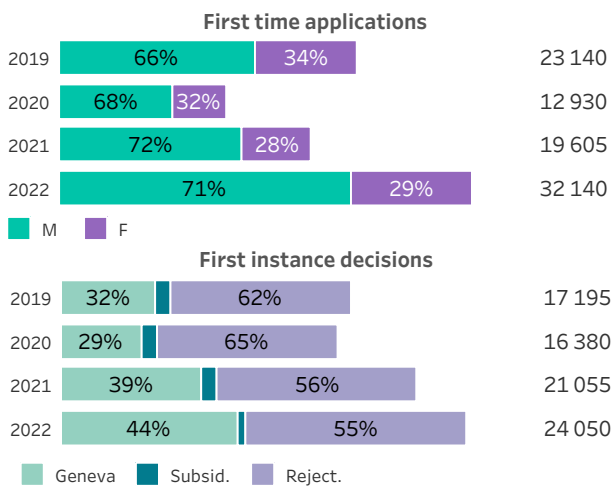

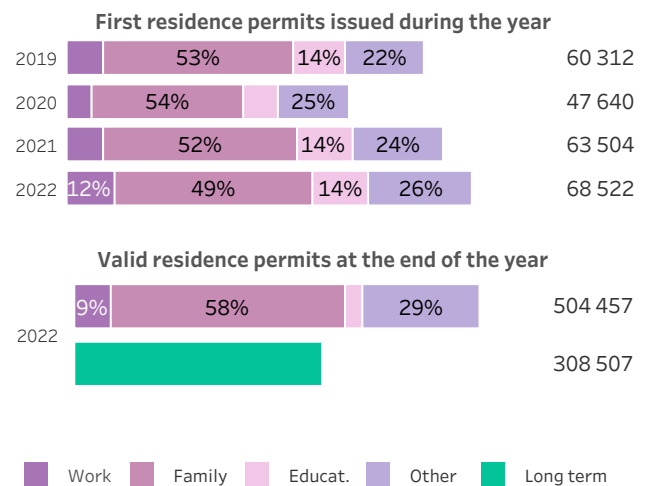
Visas applied for, issued and not issued (in thousands)



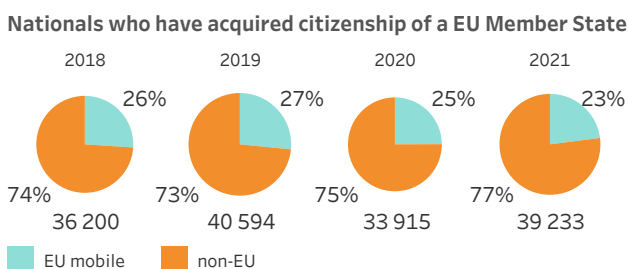

Population structure 2022 (in thousands)

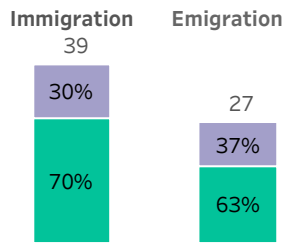

Population 2022 (in thousands)

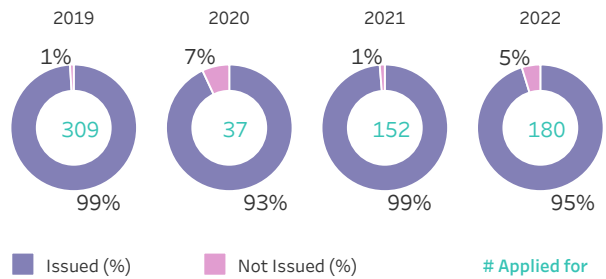


Annual flows 2021 (in thousands)



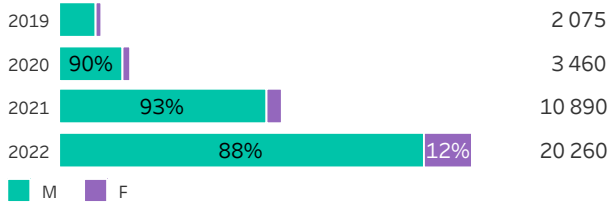

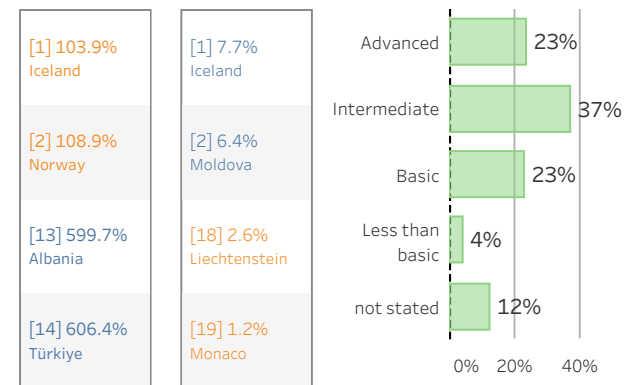

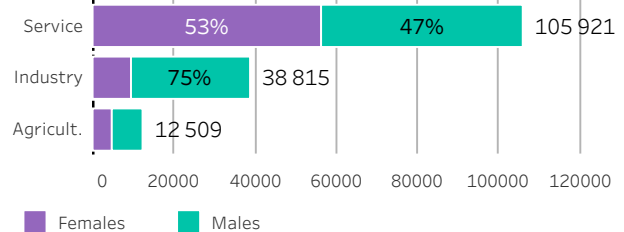

1. INTRODUCTION

CONTEXT

As Russia invaded Ukraine in February 2022, millions of persons from Ukraine fled to other European countries. This has resulted in one of the largest and fastest movements of displaced persons since the Second World War. Just four days after the start of the invasion, UNHCR estimated the number of refugees to be 500 000. With millions of individuals from Ukraine seeking refuge in various European countries over the course of 2022 and 2023,

In response to this war of aggression, the European governments and institutions reacted quickly and boldly by imposing exceptionally heavy sanctions on Russia, by sending military aid to Ukraine, and by activating the Temporary Protection Directive in record time. Through Council Decision 2022/382, this Directive facilitated the temporary settlement of millions of individuals fleeing the war in the EU, streamlining administrative processes and minimising formalities.

The remarkable support demonstrated by European citizens towards those fleeing the war - including offering their homes and organising various solidarity actions - has been a testament to the compassion and solidarity within European communities. However, as the war approaches its two-year mark, signs of solidarity fatigue among the European public are beginning to emerge, reflecting the inevitable strain that prolonged emergency situations can place on public sentiment.

This section of the Atlas of Migration analyses the evolving trends in public support for individuals fleeing the Russian war on Ukraine, providing valuable insights into the shifting landscape of public opinion and the implications for migration policies. It also offers a brief overview of the current number of beneficiaries of temporary protection in the EU, using the latest available data. Understanding these trends and sentiments is vital for policymakers to navigate the evolving dynamics of public support and ensure the effective implementation of policies that address the needs of displaced persons, while fostering solidarity and integration within European societies.

BENEFICIARIES OF TEMPORARY PROTECTION IN THE EU

By August 2023, almost 4.2 million persons displaced by the Russian war in Ukraine had temporary protection status in one of the EU Member States. Almost two-thirds of the

all beneficiaries of the temporary protection status were female. One-third of the total were minors.

The Member States hosting the largest numbers of beneficiaries of temporary protection were Germany (1 175 695 people; 28 % of the total), Poland (960 550; 23 %) and Czechia (365 085; 9 %).

In relative terms, the Member States hosting the largest numbers of beneficiaries of temporary protection were Czechia (3 472 people per 100 000 inhabitants), Estonia (2 687 people per 100 000 inhabitants), Lithuania (2 574 people per 100 000 inhabitants) and Poland (2 551 people per 100 000 inhabitants).

Figure 1 shows the number and share of people benefitting from temporary protection at the end of August 2023, by sex (top) and by sex and age group (bottom). Please note that the different age groups are not split into equally large brackets.

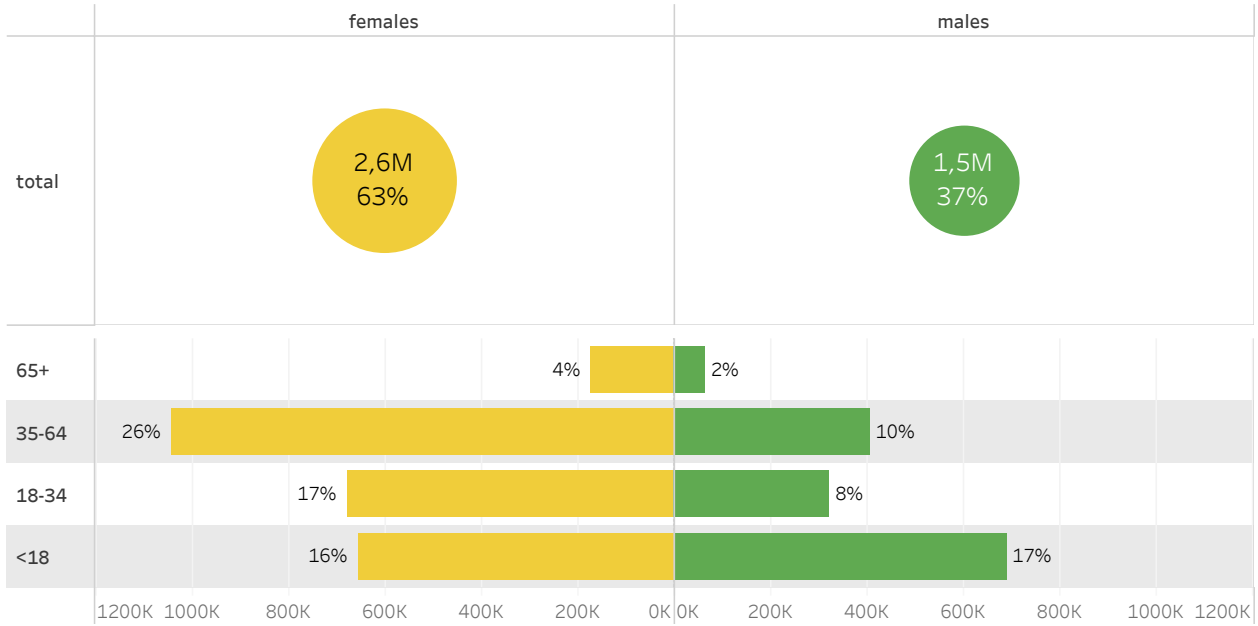


FIGURE 2. Distribution of beneficiaries of temporary protection in Europe at the end of August 2023: absolute numbers (bubble size) and per 100 000 inhabitants (background colour).

The map on figure 2 shows the number of people benefitting from temporary protection, at the end of August 2023, by country.

The numbers are shown in absolute terms (size of the yellow bubbles) and in proportion to the number of inhabitants of the country (shade of blue background colour).

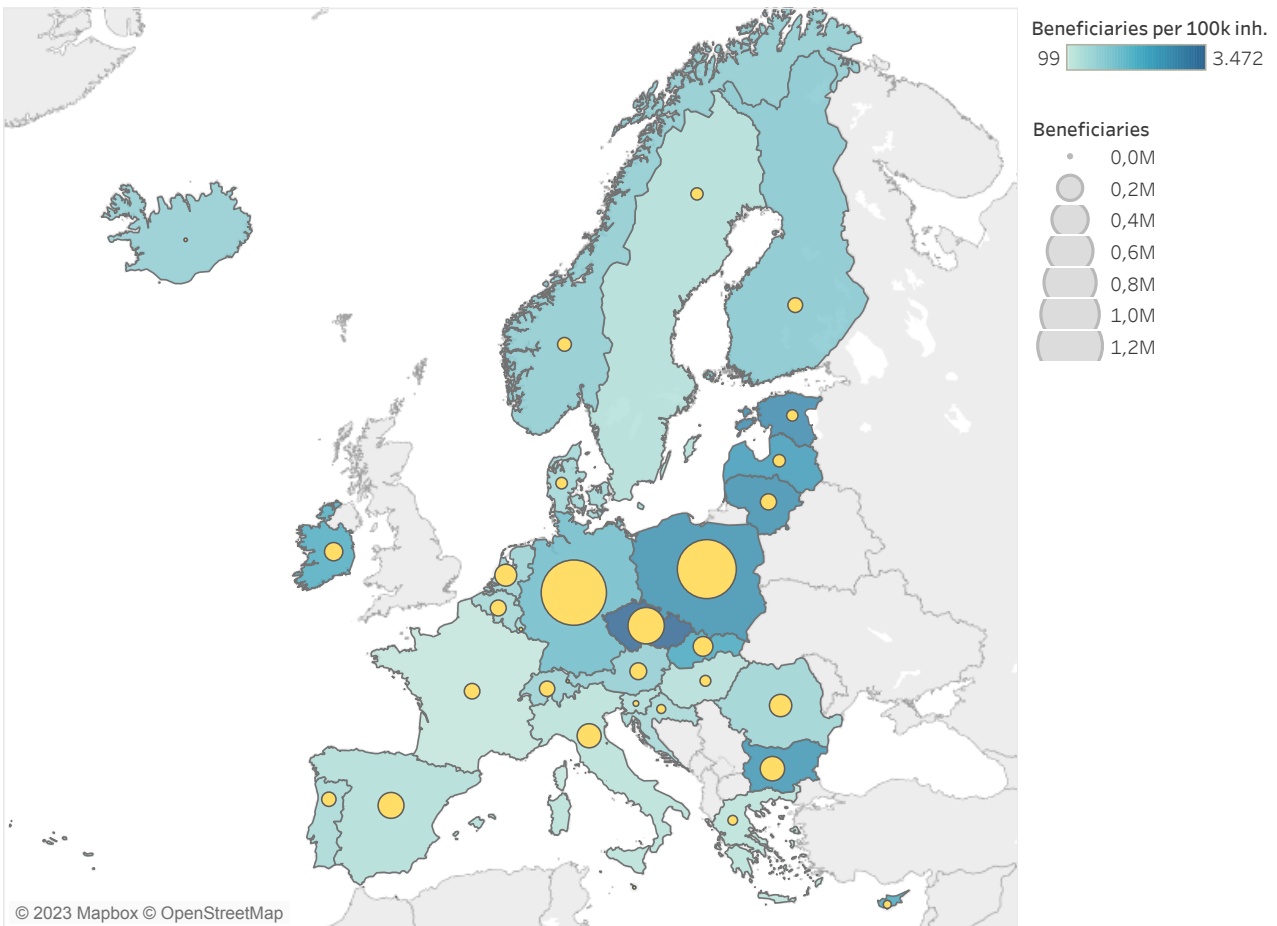
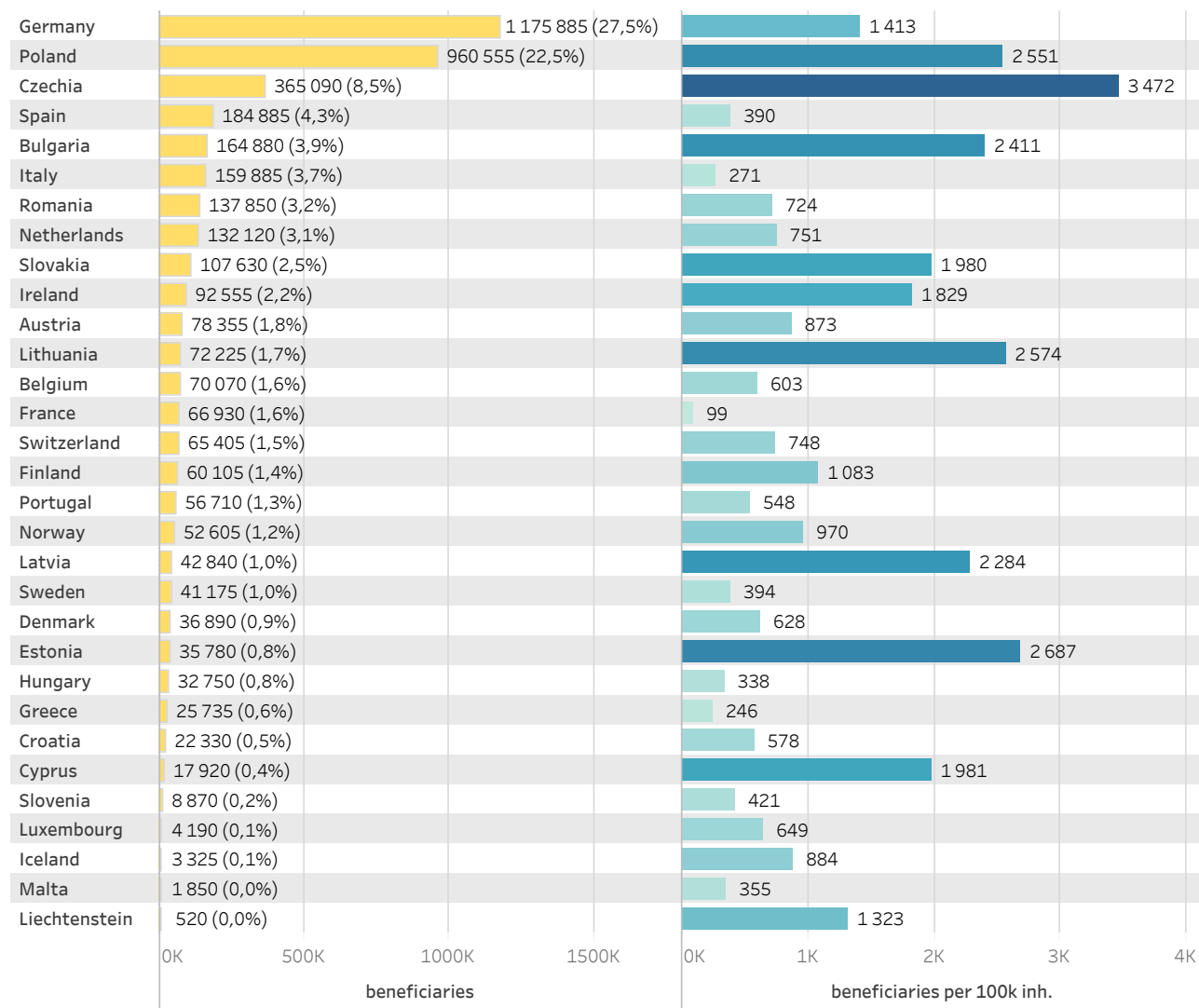


FIGURE 3. Distribution of beneficiaries of temporary protection in Europe at the end of August 2023: in absolute numbers (left) and per 100 000 inhabitants (right).

The two bar charts in figure 3 show the absolute number (on the left) and the relative number (on the right) of people benefitting from temporary protection, in each European country at the end of August 2023. Relative values are expressed per 100 000 inhabitants.

The total number of beneficiaries of temporary protection in the 31 European countries was 4 156 060. The vast majority were Ukrainian nationals, but others were among the beneficiaries too, e.g. Russian, Nigerian, and Moroccan nationals.

The map in Figure 2 and the two bar charts in Figure 3 build on the same data.

2. SUPPORT FOR PEOPLE FLEEING THE WAR

This chapter presents the descriptive analyses of a variety of surveys that have recorded Europeans' attitudes about the role of the EU in managing asylum seekers and migrants. The data shows that the overall support for welcoming displaced persons in the EU has dropped but remains high. The results indicate that while there are notable differences between Member States, at the time of writing this chapter, these differences did not conflict with an overall high level of support to the persons fleeing the war.

Following the Russian aggression against Ukraine on 24 February 2022, the European institutions, Member States, and citizens mobilised in support of Ukraine and the Ukrainian population. The EU adopted a number of measures that put into practice full solidarity with Ukraine and its people, including economic and financial assistance, humanitarian aid, civil protection support, military support, support in the investigation and prosecution of war crimes, support in the reconstruction of a democratic Ukraine, and reception of refugees through the EU temporary protection mechanism.¹ (Belmonte, Minora, & Tintori, 2023)

The European Commission ordered a Flash Eurobarometer survey to obtain input from citizens in the EU regarding their attitudes on the EU's response to the war in Ukraine.² The Flash Eurobarometer survey was conducted between 13 April and 20 April 2022 as well as between 24 and 31 August 2023 and explored opinions on a wide range of aspects pertaining to the war.³ For purposes of this report, we focus on questions that can provide indications on solidarity and solidarity fatigue.

All figures presented in this chapter show the percentage of respondents; hence, they are not weighted for the population of the countries

THE EU HAS SHOWN SOLIDARITY WITH UKRAINE

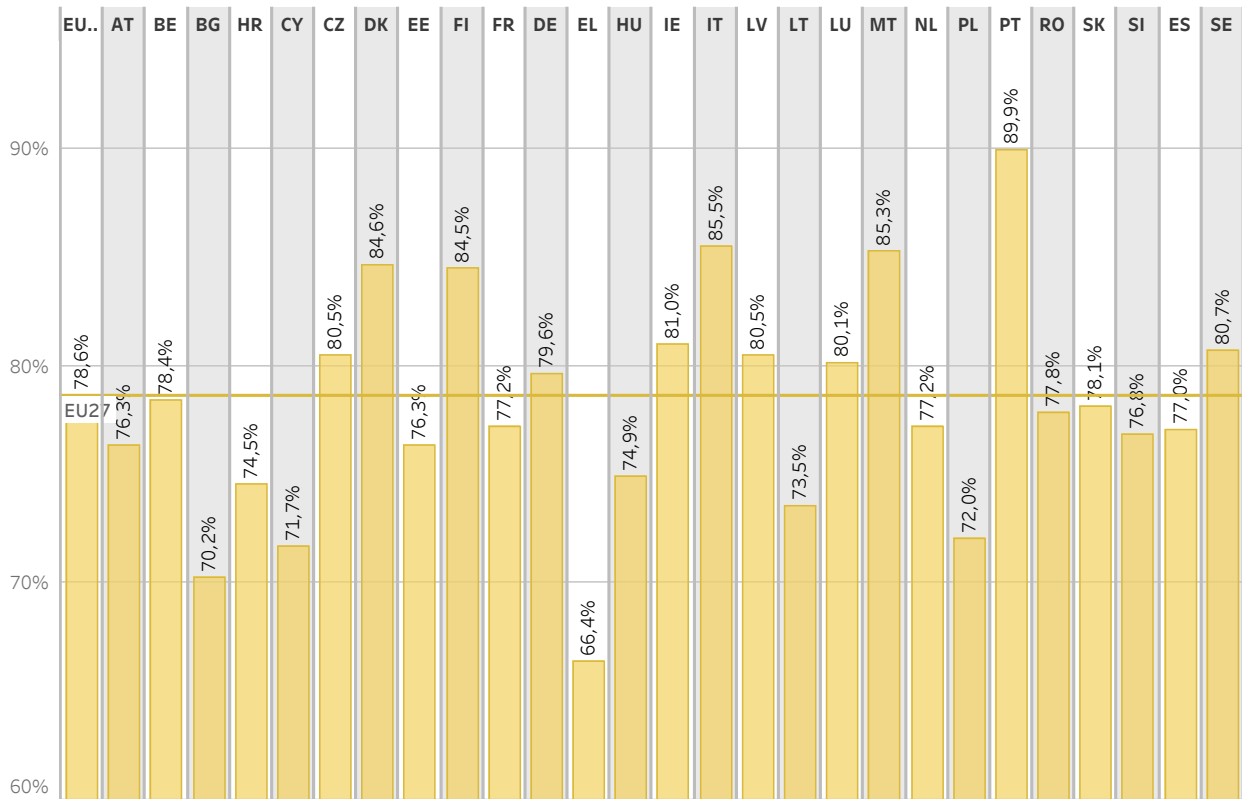
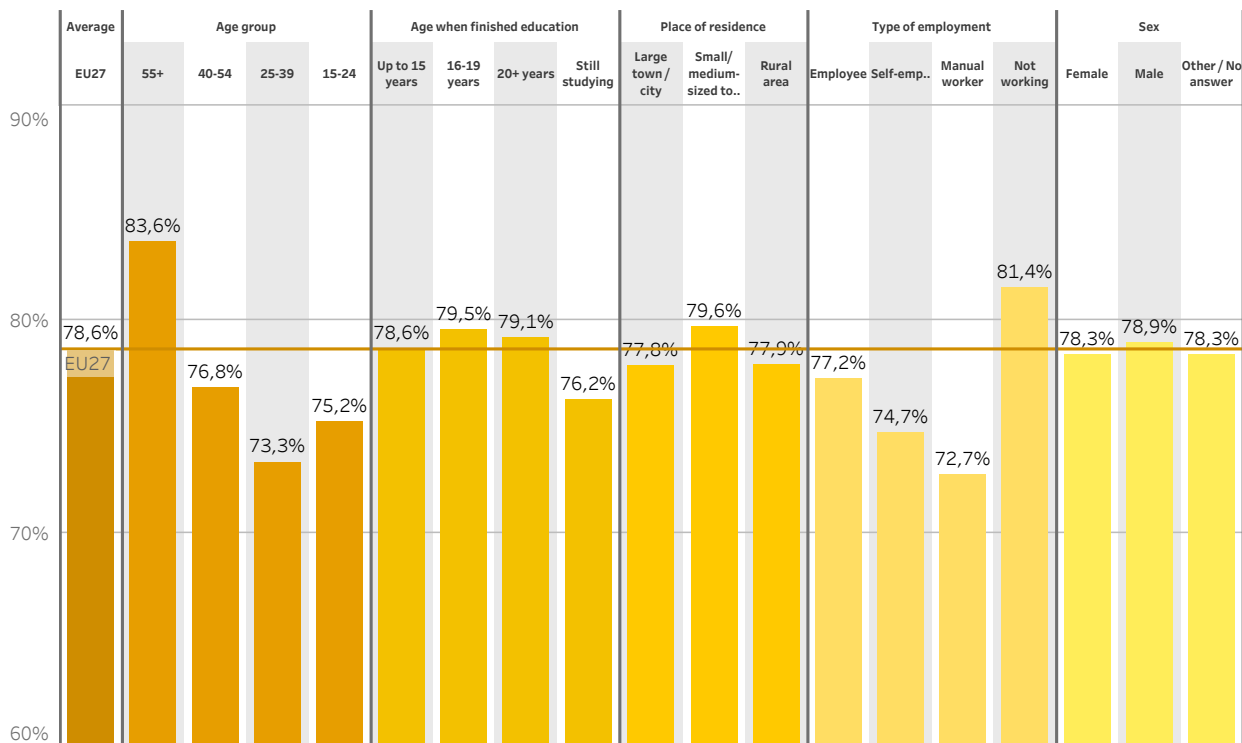


FIGURE 5. Share of persons agreeing that the EU has shown solidarity towards Ukraine, by socio-demographics.

Figure 4 and 5 in this chapter illustrate that a large majority of Europeans agree that since the war started, the EU has shown solidarity with Ukraine. Across the EU27, the share of respondents agreeing corresponds to 78.6 %. Slight differences are noticeable when analysing the data by Member State and by the socio-demographic characteristics of respondents.

Looking at the results of the survey by country, we see that 11 Member States recorded shares higher than the EU27 average, with Portugal (89.9 %), Italy (85.5 %), Malta (85.3 %), Denmark and Finland (84.5 %) in the top positions. The lowest shares of people agreeing that the EU has shown solidarity towards Ukraine are found in Greece (66.4 %), Bulgaria (70.2 %), Cyprus (71.7 %), Poland (72 %) and Lithuania (73.5 %).

Older respondents and people who are not working tend to agree more than younger and employed persons that the EU has shown solidarity towards Ukraine. Respondents aged 55 and over show a notably high level of agreement (83.6 %), as do persons who declared not to be working (81.4 %).

There are no noticeable differences when it comes to education, sex and place of living.

REACTION TO THE WAR OF FELLOW CITIZENS, NATIONAL AUTHORITIES AND EU INSTITUTIONS

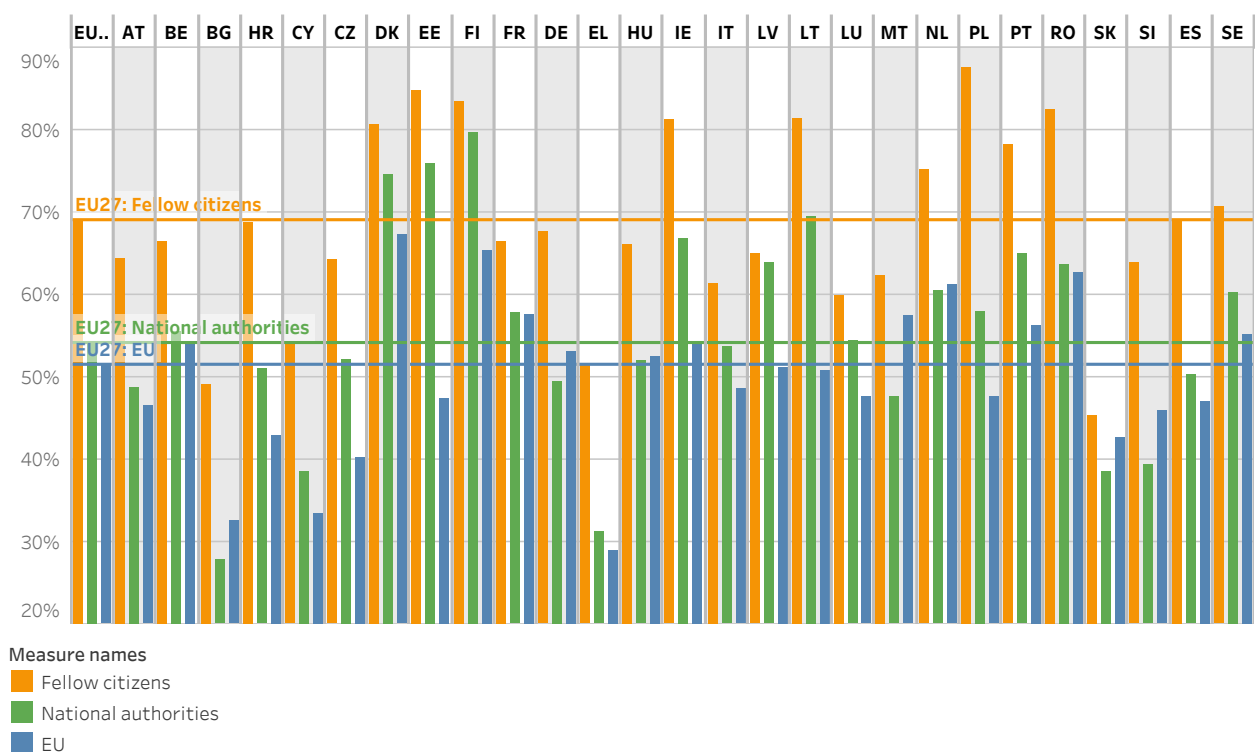
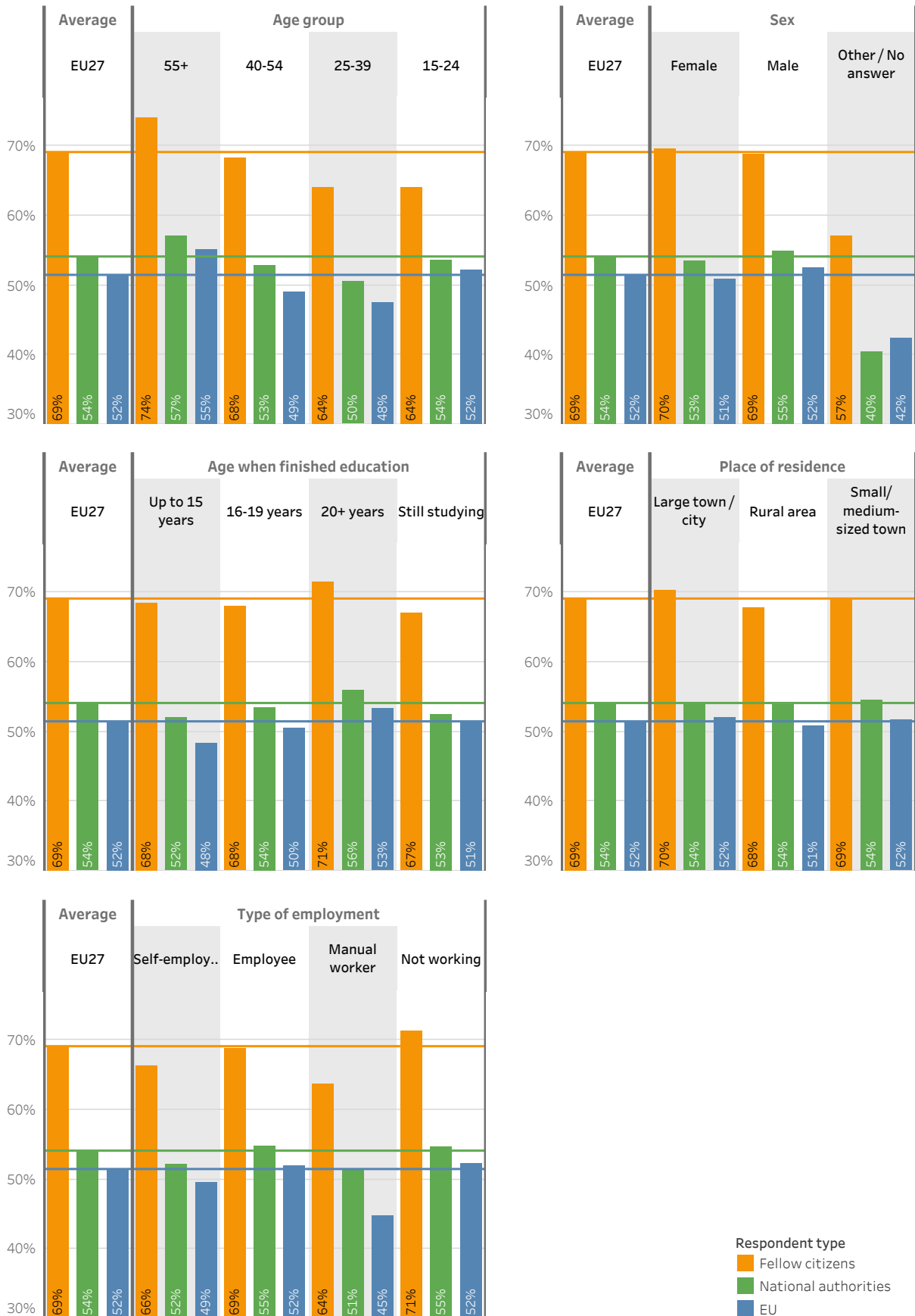


FIGURE 7. Share of respondents satisfied with the reaction of fellow citizens, national authorities and the EU to the war in Ukraine, by socio-demographic characteristics.

Figure 6 and 7 in this chapter show the results to the question ‘How satisfied are you with the way the following have reacted to the war in Ukraine?’ The question probed respondents’ satisfaction with the reaction of their fellow citizens, their national authorities, the European Union, with NATO, the United Nations and with the United States. The figures focus on the responses regarding fellow citizens, national governments, and the EU only. Moreover, the two figures display the results by Member State and by socio-demographic category respectively. Please note that the question does not allow for speculation about the reasons why respondents are satisfied or unsatisfied.

Overall, about half of respondents are satisfied with how the national authorities in their country and the EU authorities have responded to the war (see averages shown as blue and green lines). In most Member States, more than 60 % of respondents are satisfied with how their fellow citizens have reacted to the war in Ukraine. The Member States where satisfaction remains below 60 % are Bulgaria, Cyprus, Greece, Luxembourg and Slovakia. All in all, the results indicate that respondents’ satisfaction with their fellow citizens is higher than their satisfaction with their national authorities and with the EU across all Member States.

In most Member States (Belgium, Denmark, Finland, France, Germany, Hungary, Ireland, Latvia, Lithuania, Malta, Netherlands, Portugal, Romania and Sweden) the majority of respondents are satisfied with how the EU reacted. The lowest levels of satisfaction are recorded in Greece, Bulgaria, and Cyprus. The outcomes registered in Poland are interesting; Poland is the country that was affected the most by the arrival of people fleeing the war in Ukraine, in the early days of the invasion. An overwhelming majority of Polish respondents are satisfied with how their fellow citizens reacted. They are also satisfied with the response of their national authorities. However, the share of respondents satisfied with how the EU reacted is 47.5 %.

As discussed earlier, older respondents tend to be more satisfied with the response of the EU. They also are more satisfied with the reaction of their respective national authorities and with that of their fellow citizens to the war in Ukraine, than younger respondents. Higher educated respondents are slightly more often satisfied with the responses of their fellow citizens, their national authorities and the EU than respondents with fewer years of education or who are still studying. However, these differences across levels of education are minor. Regarding type of employment, respondents who declared not to work also expressed a higher satisfaction with the response of their fellow citizens.

There are no noticeable differences when it comes to place of living or whether the respondent was female or male.

SUPPORT FOR SPECIFIC ASPECTS

A study led by the European Commission's Joint Research Centre (JRC) provides additional insights. Making use of an online survey administered in six Member States, the study queried the support for several aspects of providing temporary protection to people fleeing the war in Ukraine. These aspects include the access to temporary work permits, free medical assistance, access to public education for minors, free movement within the EU, and public housing.

Figure 8 displays the share of respondents that support each of these individual aspects, by NUTS 1 region. Clear

national and regional patterns can be found, with Poland and Romania tending to show particularly positive attitudes and Czechia and former East Germany relatively negative attitudes. While this summary is generally true for each aspect of the policy queried, average support rates vary by question. In particular, there is much less support for providing public housing for the displaced people from Ukraine or allowing them to move freely within the EU than for the other three aspects of the policy (access to public education, health care, labour market) or temporary protection in general.

3. SUPPORT FOR PERSONS DISPLACED FROM UKRAINE

This chapter explores to what extent respondents in the EU agree with supporting Ukraine and persons displaced from Ukraine. To do so, this chapter makes use of data from:

- the Flash Eurobarometer 506: EU’s response to the war in Ukraine (European Commission - Directorate General for Communication, May 2022);
- the Flash Eurobarometer 533: EU challenges and priorities in 2023 (European Commission- Directorate General for Communication, September 2023);
- the 2022 EUI-YouGov ‘Solidarity in Europe’ (SiE) project survey (Hemerijck, Russo, & Genschel, 2022);

- the eupinions-Bertelsmann Stiftung survey, all three waves (Hoffmann and Schilgen, 2022; Hoffmann and de Vries, 2022; de Vries and Hoffmann 2022);

All figures presented in this chapter show the percentage of respondents; hence, they are not weighted for the population of the countries

SUPPORT OVER TIME AND BY SOCIO-DEMOGRAPHIC CHARACTERISTICS

In 2022 and in 2023, two Flash Eurobarometer surveys were conducted to better understand the public’s approval

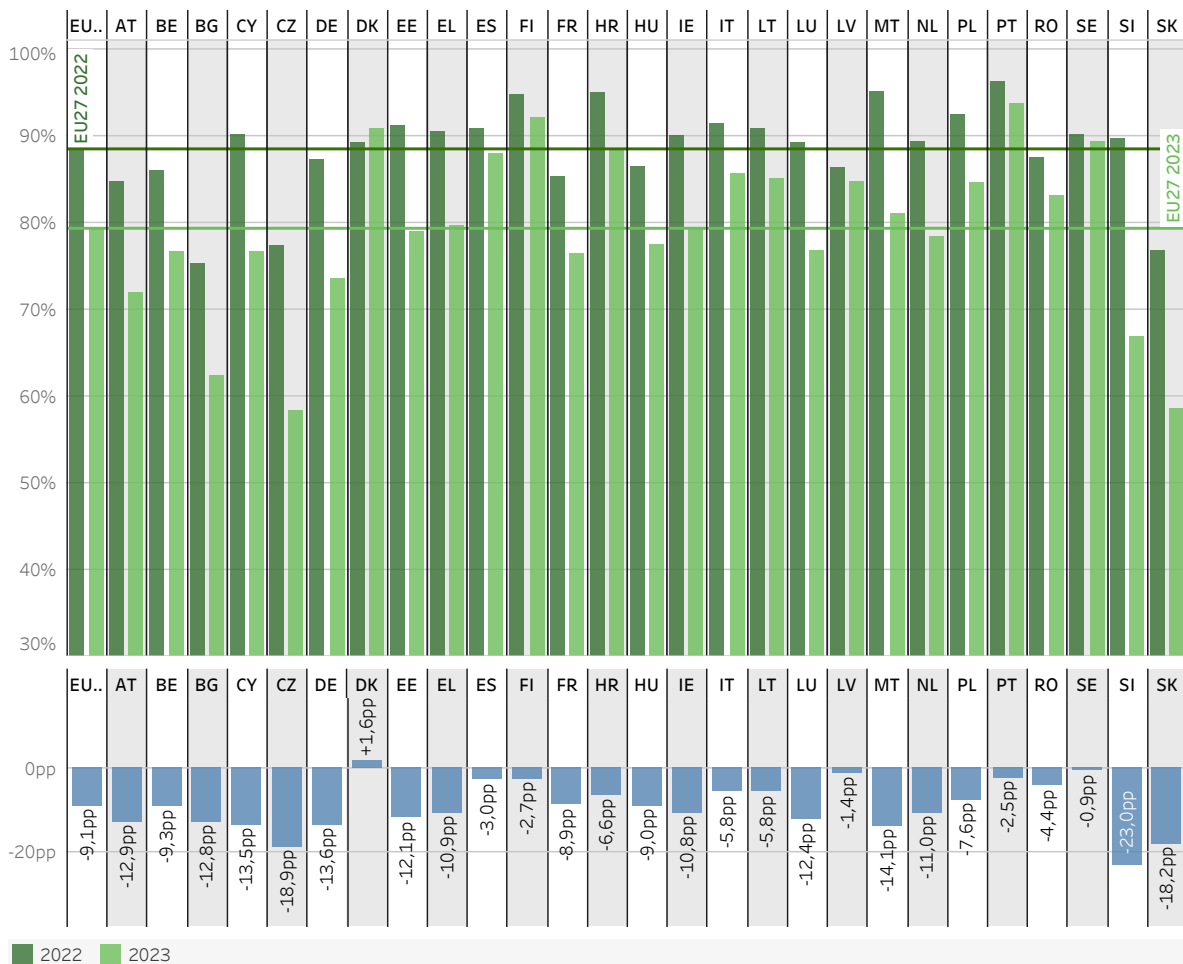
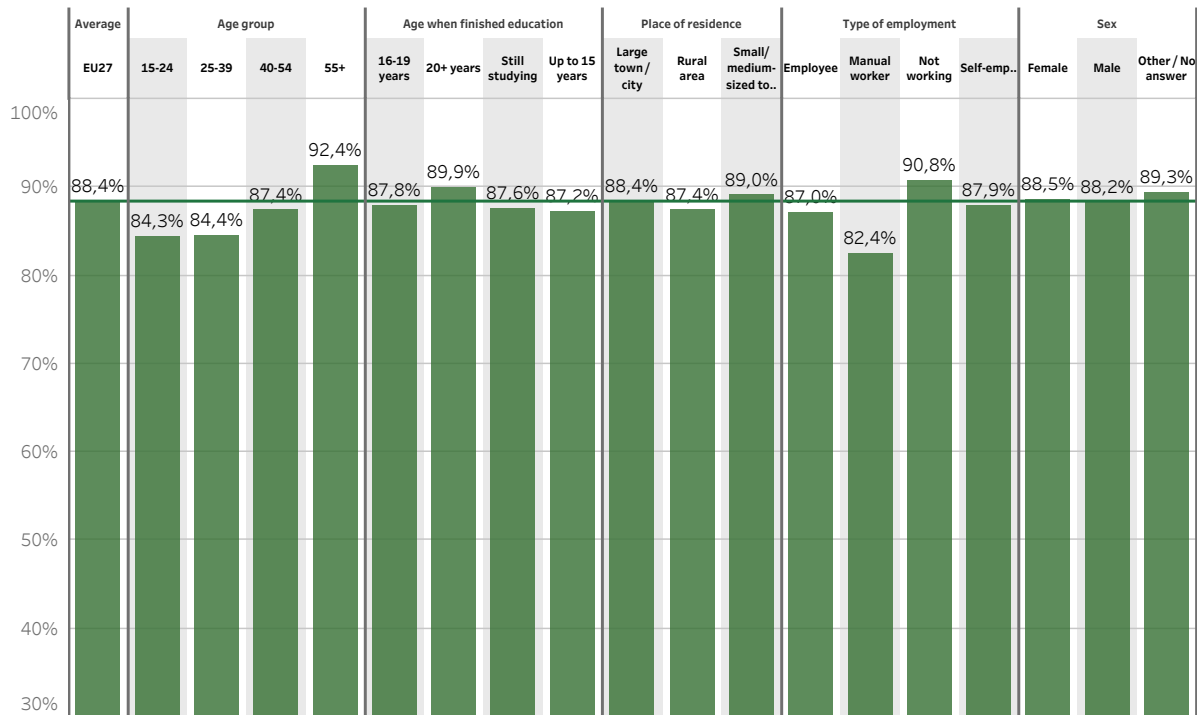


FIGURE 10. Share of EU citizens agreeing with welcoming in the country people fleeing the war, by socio-demographic characteristics (2022).

of a series of measures adopted by the EU to respond to the war in Ukraine. Among these measures, we have chosen to look into the decision to welcoming in the EU people fleeing the war.⁴ The figures display the share of respondents who agreed with this measure, the variation of this agreement over time, and what socio-demographic factors affect the approval of welcoming in the EU people fleeing the war.

In 2022, the approval for welcoming people fleeing the war in the EU is high across all Member States. On average, 88 % of all respondents expressed their approval. Even the lowest approval rates (Bulgaria, 75 %; Czechia and Slovakia, 77 %) are quite high.

In 2023, 79 % of the respondents approved welcoming people fleeing the war, a slightly lower share compared to the previous year.⁵ This figure also shows the variation between the two years by Member State. Czechia, Slovenia and Slovakia are the Member States with the greatest decrease in approval rates. Denmark is the only Member State where the share of respondents approving the measure had slightly increased.

Figure 10 explores the same question, but takes into account socio-demographic characteristics. Socio-demographics do

not seem to greatly influence agreement, except for age and type of employment. People aged 55 years and over express greater support for welcoming people fleeing the war than do people in other age groups. Also, respondents who indicated they were not working expressed greater support than the average, when looking at type of employment. Respondents employed as manual worker tend to agree less with welcoming in the country people fleeing the war than respondents in other employment types.

SUPPORT IN SPECIFIC COUNTRIES

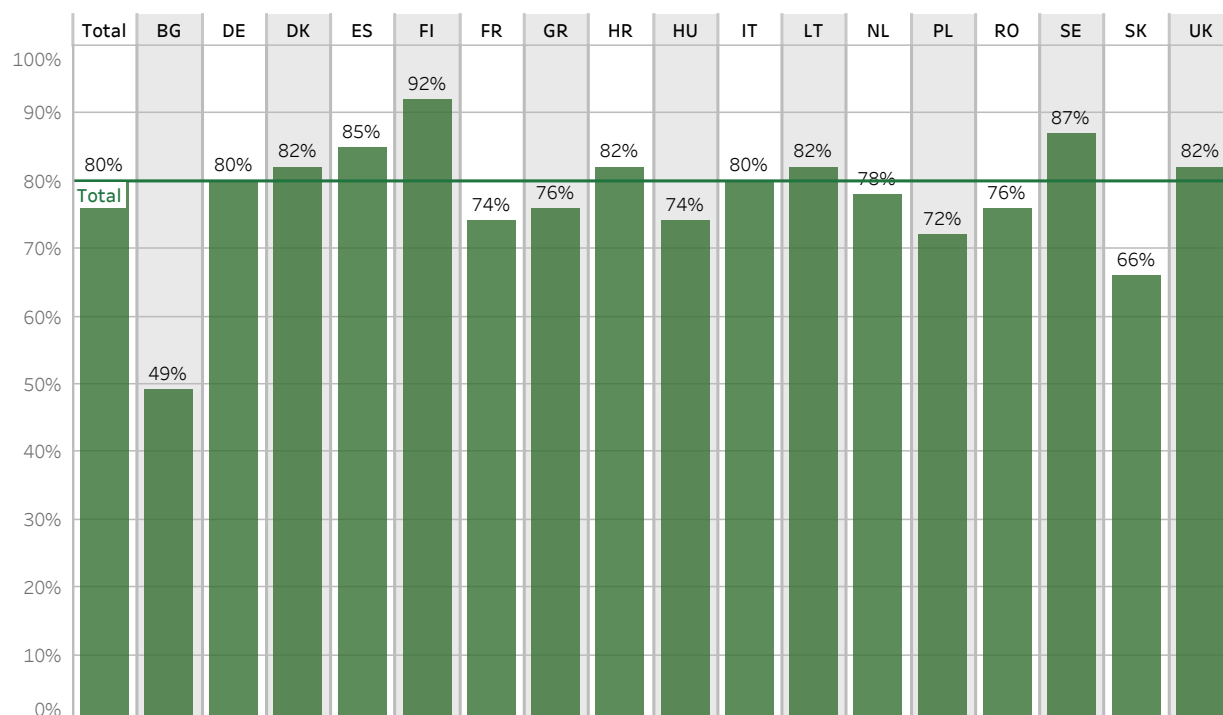
The EUI-YouGov 'Solidarity in Europe' (SiE) project⁶ has been monitoring the development of solidarity in Europe since 2018. In April 2022, the project's annual survey was launched including specific questions on the war in Ukraine. The EUI-YouGov survey interviewed a representative sample of respondents across 16 EU Member States and the UK. Incidentally, both this survey and the first iteration of the Flash Eurobarometer 506 were carried out in the same month.

Figure 11 illustrates the share of respondents supporting the welcoming of Ukrainian refugees in each country. It is important to highlight that the wording of the surveyed

question here was different from the one used in the Flash Eurobarometer. The EUI-YouGov survey question asked respondents whether they agreed with ‘allowing Ukrainian refugees to enter the country’.⁷ It did not mention the EU or its role in promoting or implementing support measures. The results of the two surveys can therefore not be directly compared. Nevertheless, it is interesting to observe the results of two concurrent surveys investigating a similar topic.

Overall, an overwhelming majority of respondents (80 %) are in support of allowing Ukrainian refugees to enter the country. There are differences across Member States, where support ranges from 92 % in Finland to 66 % in Slovakia, while Bulgaria (49 %) is the only country where there is no majority support for the measure.

CONSIDERATIONS FROM RELEVANT STUDIES

In 2022, the Observatory for Public Attitudes to Migration (OPAM) at the European University Institute (EUI) enquired into the acceptance of displaced persons from Ukraine compared to that of refugees from Syria (Dražanová & Geddes, 2022). The OPAM ran a survey experiment in May and June that year, as well as in April 2023, probing the extent to which respondents thought that refugees should be allowed to move

and live in their country. They randomly split the sample into two, with half of the respondents being asked explicitly about the acceptance of displaced persons from Ukraine, while the other half was asked about refugees from Syria. The results indicate that participants in all eight EU Member States covered in the survey generally favour displaced persons from Ukraine over refugees from Syria (ibid.).

The authors indicate two possible reasons for this difference. First, they link it to the ethnic and cultural differences between host populations and Syrian refugees, which may be perceived as threatening to national identities. Second, they suggest respondents in European countries may have had more opportunities to be in direct contact with displaced persons from Ukraine than with refugees from Syria. Moreover, a third factor could be that the war on Ukraine is still very fresh in people’s minds, whereas the arrival of refugees from Syria in large numbers dates back to 2015. Therefore, the lower level of support for Syrian refugees could also be explained by an expected decrease in solidarity over time (EUAA, 2023).

SUPPORT OVER TIME IN SELECTED EU MEMBER STATES

The *eupinions project*, promoted by the Bertelsmann Foundation⁸, records how public opinion and attitudes have

evolved since the beginning of the Russian war in Ukraine. *eupinions* collects data from each EU Member State in 22 languages every quarter, relying on a representative sample of the population with regard to age, gender, education and country/region. The *eupinions* project works with two sets of data. One set is aimed at capturing the contours of public opinion in the EU27 as a whole, while the other aims to identify national specifics with a more in-depth focus on respondents in Belgium, France, Germany, Italy, the Netherlands, Poland and Spain. In 2022, *eupinions* carried out three waves of data collection with nearly 12 000 EU citizens, surveying their opinions on a range of issues related to the war in Ukraine.⁹

The wording of the question¹⁰ for which the results are displayed, differs from that used in the Flash Eurobarometer. Therefore, it is not advisable to compare results across these surveys although they explore a similar topic. The *eupinions* survey focuses on how attitudes have changed over time.

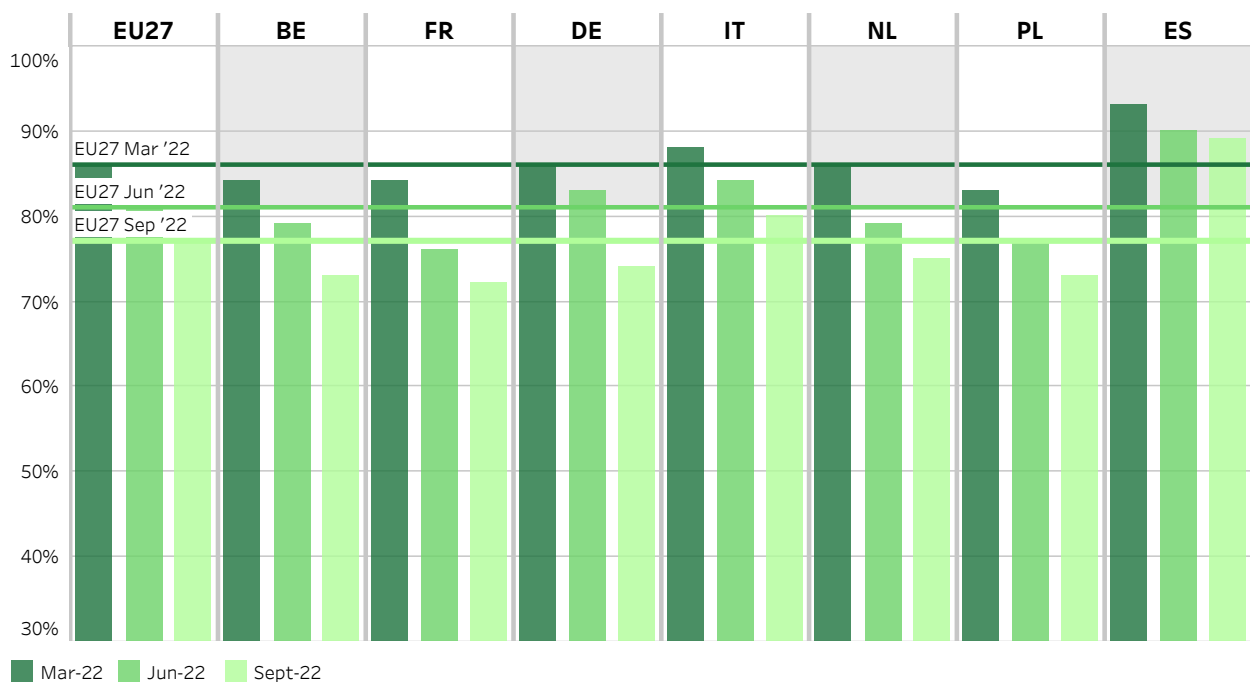
Figure 12 illustrates how the support for accepting refugees from Ukraine evolved between March and September 2022. At the EU27 level, this support decreased during this time. However, support continued to remain high at 77 %. Considering the results in individual Member States, levels of support have dropped the most in France and Germany, followed by Belgium, the Netherlands, Poland, Italy and Spain. Note that Poland and Germany are the top two destination Member States of beneficiaries of temporary protection (Belmonte, Minora, and Tintori 2023).

CONSIDERATIONS FROM OTHER KEY STUDIES

The researchers behind the *eupinions* project put things into perspective in a recent piece (Hoffmann and de Vries 2022; 2023) in which they state that Europeans are still highly supportive of the Ukrainian cause despite differences between Member States. However, they also warn about visible signs of solidarity fatigue among respondents and the fact that Europeans are worried. In particular, they register high levels of anxiety among the respondents as the war continues, which are caused by threats to the geopolitical stability of the continent, uncertainties about the economic impact of the war, especially on energy and food prices, and by inflation.

Hoffman and de Vries (2022) conclude, ‘*European governments and officials can thus continue to demonstrate courage and resolve in their effort to support Ukraine. As they do so, however, they need to remain consistent in communicating their goals and intentions. [...] These findings underscore the importance of cultivating public trust through a sound messaging strategy that regularly informs the public of the facts, options and reasons that go into the measures taken. As a crisis persists, the ability of a government to assess, adapt or affirm its policies are vital to strengthening its credibility. One year into this war, European politicians can count on the support of the European public. Bold measures and smart communication will go a long way in anchoring this support.*

4. SELF-REPORTED SOLIDARITY ACTIONS

This chapter explores data from the JRC Survey on Solidarity and Attitudes towards Displaced Persons from Ukraine (JRC-SA-DPU). This survey examines self-reported solidarity actions supporting persons displaced from Ukraine, such as hosting families, donating money or goods, volunteering, or supporting Ukrainians on social media. The survey included 27 017 adult respondents from six EU countries (Czechia, France, Germany, Hungary, Poland, and Romania), 6 503 of whom were from Poland and about 4 100 from each of the other countries. The survey sought to capture any evolving trends or changes over time by conducting two waves of data collection about seven months apart (August 2022 and March 2023). Demographic quotas ensured the sample matched the country's adult population in terms of gender, age, education, employment status, and geographic area of residence.

The survey asked respondents whether they had been helping persons from Ukraine in the last four months and in what way. Overall, 58 % of the respondents indicated they had actively supported people from Ukraine in the four months before the interview. Specifically, 33 % said they had donated goods (clothes, food, medicines), 24 %

had donated money, 12 % had supported Ukrainians on social media, 9 % had participated in some volunteering activity, 6 % had hosted people in their homes, and 10 % had performed other support activities.

CO-OCCURRENCE OF SOLIDARITY ACTIONS

Figure 13 illustrates the distribution of self-reported solidarity actions. It also shows how often two different solidarity actions occurred together. The high frequency of co-occurring events demonstrates the tendency of individuals to participate in a variety of solidarity actions rather than focusing on just one. Simple calculations using this data show that, among the 24 % of respondents who reported having contributed money, one in two (50 %) had also donated goods, and over one in ten (13 %) had also volunteered. Conversely, less than four in ten (37 %) reported having donated money among those who had donated goods. These patterns highlight the asymmetries and strong correlations among different donations, underscoring the complex nature of solidarity actions.

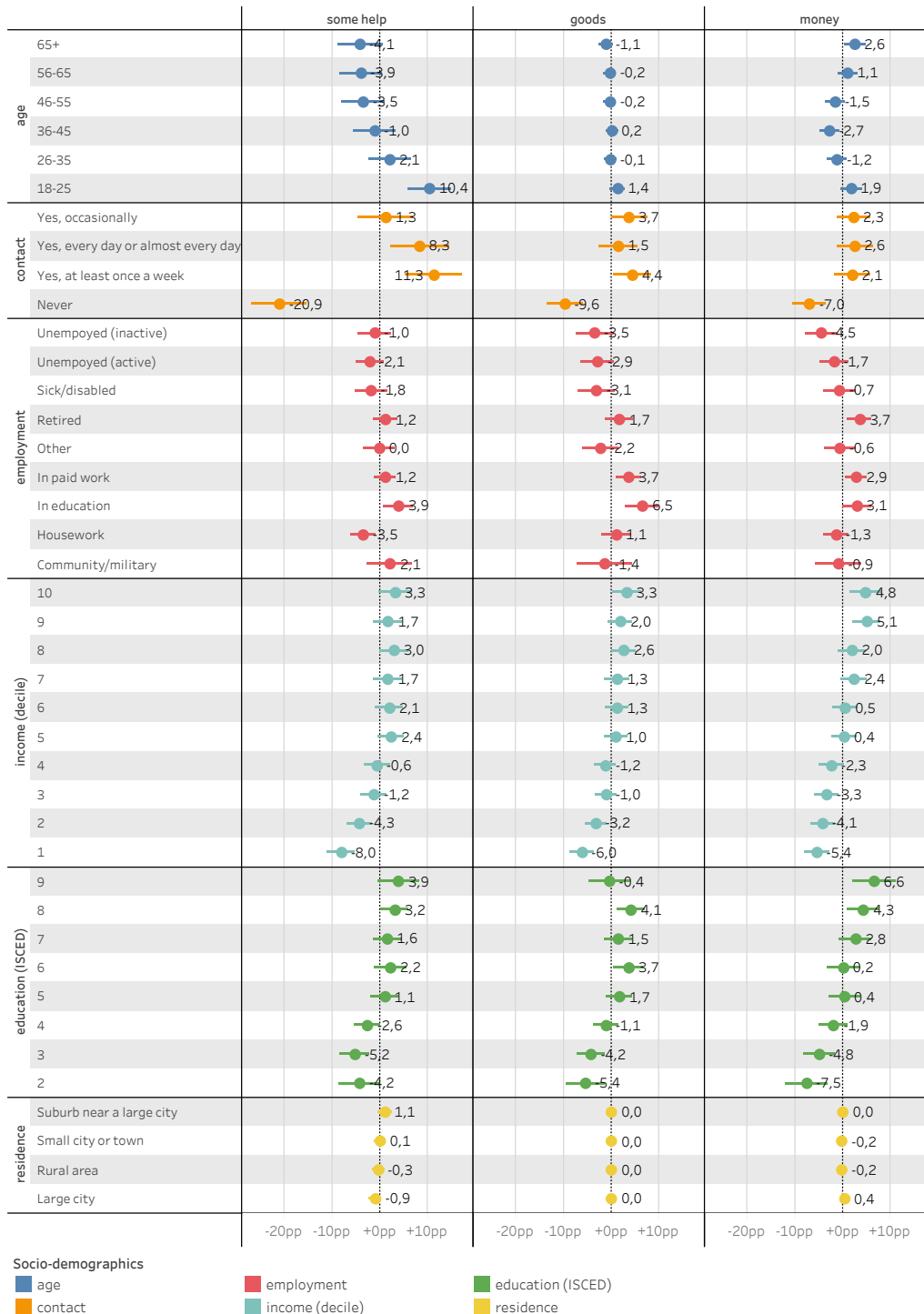
SOCIO-DEMOGRAPHIC CHARACTERISTICS AND SOLIDARITY ACTIONS

Figure 14 illustrates the effect of common socio-demographics on solidarity, including income and education. It shows the estimated effect of certain

socio-demographic characteristics - i.e. the respondents' education (expressed in ISCED levels), age, gender, religious affiliation, employment status, geographic region of residence, area of residence (urban vs rural), and income (as country-specific deciles from 1 to 10) - on how likely people are to report having shown solidarity, e.g. by donating money or goods, showing support on social media, or hosting displaced persons.

CONSIDERATIONS FOR EACH SOCIO-DEMOGRAPHIC CHARACTERISTIC

Economic conditions. As shown in the figure, respondents in the bottom income deciles are over five percentage points less likely to engage in solidarity actions --- i.e., all actions, from donating money to volunteering time. This effect persists even when considering individual differences in education, geographic origin, and other critical demographics, and it remains consistent after adjusting for individual differences in values and opinions, including political orientation and religious affiliation (see below). Therefore, despite potential confounding factors, this finding highlights the significant influence of economic conditions on solidarity.

Education. In most countries, studies show that, on average, more educated individuals harbour more positive attitudes towards refugees and migrants (Cowling et al., 2019). A novel finding consistent with this tendency, our regression results show that respondents with higher education are about five percentage points likelier to engage in solidarity actions than those with low education.

Age. Evidence on the impact of age on attitudes towards migrants or refugees is mixed (Cowling et al., 2019) and it is not easy to disentangle the effect of biological age from the effect of cohort (and corresponding historical experience). In our data, younger respondents are significantly more inclined to participate in solidarity actions than older individuals, all else equal. This shows particularly for types of help requiring physical presence (volunteering time) or digital skills (supporting on social media).

Time changes. Interestingly, there are only minor changes in solidarity over time, with an overall drop of three percentage points between the first and second data collections (about seven months). This negligible effect could be because respondents had to consider a time window of four months before the interview, which was too large to detect differences.

Social contacts. The social contact theory (see Paluck et al., 2019 for a recent review) proposes that individuals who can engage in meaningful social contact with refugees are more likely to develop inclusive attitudes, which could spur solidarity actions. The survey asked respondents to assess the frequency of interactions with people from Ukraine before the war. As illustrated in this figure, respondents who reported having never interacted with Ukrainians before the war were substantially less likely to engage in solidarity actions. This finding highlights the role of personal interactions in fostering solidarity. Yet, asking individuals to recollect their interactions before a given event, such as a war, may introduce bias and inaccuracies, thereby limiting the robustness of the conclusions drawn from this finding.

POLITICAL ORIENTATION AND SOLIDARITY ACTIONS

Figure 15 illustrates the impact of political preferences and religious affiliation on solidarity actions. This is a slightly extended version of the model presented before. This extended model includes additional variables to capture self-reported differences in political leanings (0=left; 10=right), fears of economic competition (0=migrants are bad for the economy; 10=migrants are good for the economy), and attitudes towards the EU's granting temporary protection for displaced Ukrainians (0=oppose; 10=support). The model also includes a measure of social trust (0=you can't be too careful; 10 = most people can be trusted) and support for policies to reduce income differences between the rich and poor (0=disagree; 10=agree).

CONSIDERATIONS FOR EACH BELIEF/ORIENTATION

Economic fears. Studies have found that Europeans view refugees and economic migrants as different groups of migrants (De Coninck, 2020; Abdelaaty and Steel, 2022) and tend to exhibit more welcoming attitudes towards people arriving in their country for humanitarian reasons, all else equal. Even so, fears of the adverse impact of hosting many displaced persons on the country's economy can overpower humanitarian concerns and foster a negative attitude. This negative attitude may discourage people from showing solidarity towards displaced persons. Consistent with this view, this figure illustrates that the greater economic concerns are, the lower is the probability of engaging in solidarity actions. While the described association between economic concerns and solidarity actions may not seem controversial, we must interpret it cautiously. When asking people about their fears of migrants, the response may encompass a range of concerns beyond just economic considerations, thereby introducing bias.

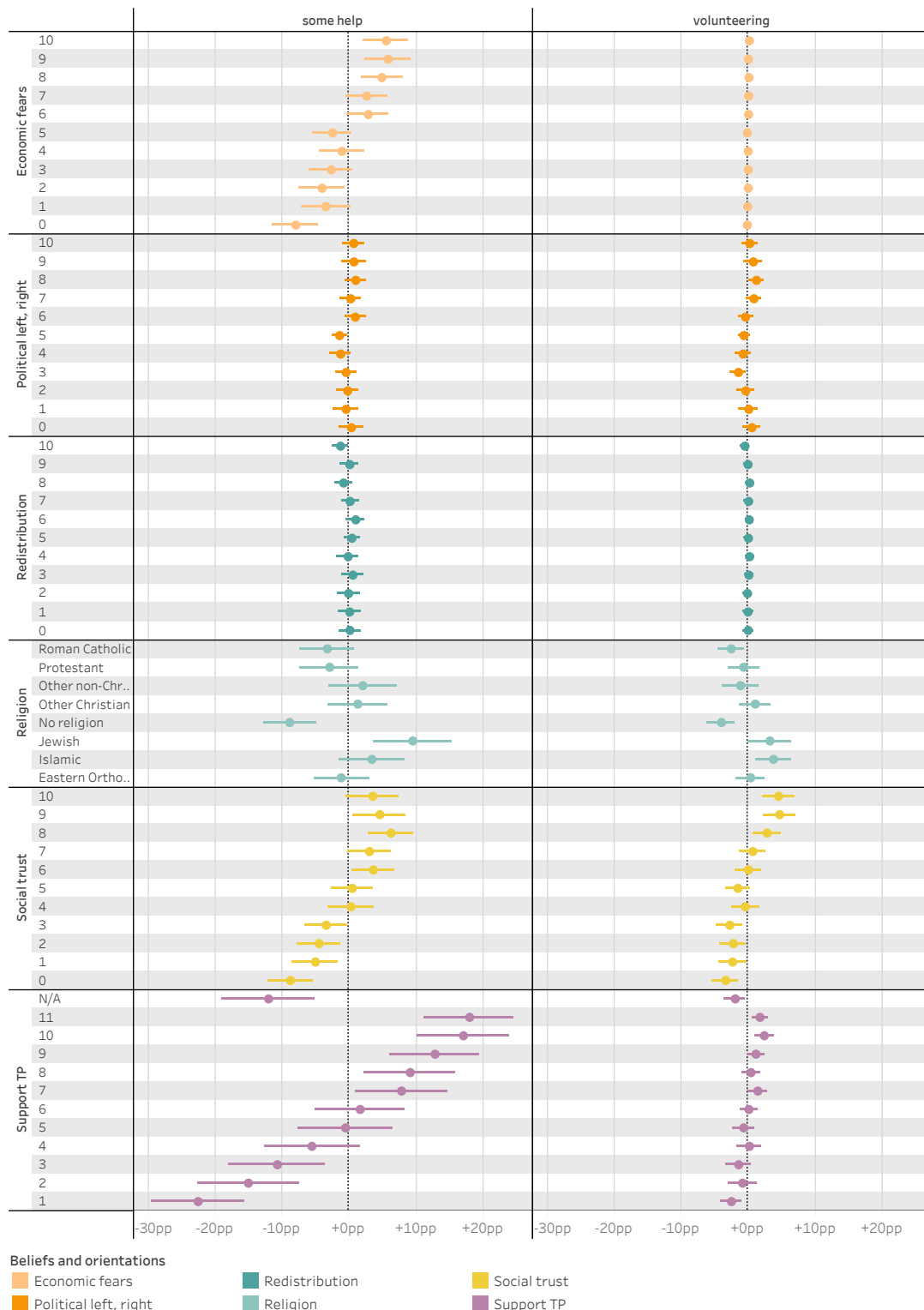
Social trust. Analysis of the European Social Survey has shown that Europeans with high social trust exhibit more positive attitudes towards immigration, regardless of several individual and contextual variables (Herrerros and Criado, 2009). Here, the survey explores the association between social trust and the propensity to act, showing a robust positive association between our measure of social trust and participation in solidarity actions.

Political orientation and the EU. The survey finds little evidence of an effect of the two different measures of political affiliation used (left-right and support for income redistribution). However, a robust association exists between the expressed support for the EU's temporary protection and solidarity actions. Therefore, despite commonly used measures not being strong predictors, the survey shows a prominent role of political attitudes towards EU migration policy in shaping the supply of solidarity actions.

Religious affiliation. Being religious can affect solidarity actions in multiple ways. For example, many studies on charitable giving find that religious people are more likely to help others (Bekkers and Wiepking, 2011). Religious people may feel more compelled to help because of their values

or because of their proximity to religious organisations that are engaged in solidarity actions. Consistent with this view, our data show that respondents without religious affiliation were less likely than others to report solidarity actions.

5. CONCLUSIONS

This chapter examined the results of several surveys that were conducted to gauge public support for welcoming displaced persons from Ukraine in the EU. Overall, the surveys paint a picture of generally high levels of support for welcoming displaced persons from Ukraine in the EU, with some variations between Member States and some differences in support for specific aspects of the welcoming policies.

The data shows that while overall support for welcoming the persons fleeing the war has dropped slightly, it remains relatively high nearly two years after the start of the war. A Flash Eurobarometer survey conducted in 2022 showed that in the first year of the war, the approval for welcoming people fleeing the war in the EU was high across all Member States. On average, 88 % of all respondents expressed their approval. Even the lowest approval rates (Bulgaria, 75 %; Czechia and Slovakia, 77 %) were relatively high. In the 2023 Flash Eurobarometer survey, 79 % of the respondents approved welcoming people fleeing the war - a slightly lower share compared to the previous year.

The surveys found that there are notable differences in support between Member States, and a slight decreasing trend in approval rates over time. The approval rates dropped the most in Czechia, Slovenia and Slovakia. Denmark is the only Member State where the share of respondents approving the measure has slightly increased. People aged 55 years and over express greater support for welcoming people fleeing the war than people in other age groups.

The surveys indicate that Europeans are more supportive towards some aspects of the welcoming policies, such as access to public education, health care, and the labour market, than for others, such as providing public housing or allowing displaced persons to move freely within the EU.

The results also highlight the various ways in which people are actively demonstrating their solidarity and support for displaced persons from Ukraine. A survey conducted by the Joint Research Centre (JRC) found that a majority of respondents reported actively supporting people from Ukraine through various actions such as donating goods or money, supporting Ukrainians on social media, or participating in volunteering activities. There were only minor changes in solidarity over time, with a small overall drop between the first and second data collections. Overall, 58 % of the respondents actively supported people from Ukraine in the four months before our interview.

The study found that economic conditions significantly influence solidarity, with respondents in lower income deciles being less likely to engage in such actions, even after considering education, geographic origin, and other

demographics. More educated individuals were found to be more likely to engage in solidarity actions, showing a consistent positive trend. Younger respondents were significantly more inclined to participate in solidarity actions, especially those requiring physical presence or digital skills. The study also highlighted the role of personal interactions in fostering solidarity, with respondents who reported never interacting with Ukrainians before the war being substantially less likely to engage in solidarity actions.

The JRC study also examined the impact of political preferences and religious affiliation on solidarity actions towards displaced persons from Ukraine. It found that fears about the economic impact of hosting displaced persons can lead to negative attitudes and reduce the likelihood of engaging in solidarity actions. The study moreover highlights the positive association between social trust and participation in solidarity actions, suggesting that individuals with high social trust are more likely to exhibit positive attitudes towards immigration and engage in solidarity actions.

The survey found little evidence of the impact of political orientation on solidarity actions, but it did reveal a robust association between expressed support for the EU's temporary protection and participation in solidarity actions. Lastly, the study suggests that religious affiliation can influence solidarity actions, with religious individuals being more likely to engage in acts of solidarity, possibly due to their values or proximity to religious organisations involved in such actions. Conversely, respondents without religious affiliation were found to be less likely to report engaging in solidarity actions.

Overall, the findings suggest that policy actions aimed at addressing economic concerns and promoting social trust could contribute to fostering a more supportive and inclusive environment for displaced persons and promoting solidarity within European communities.

LIST OF DEFINITIONS

Asylum seeker

An asylum seeker is a person who has left their country and has submitted a claim for protection from persecution or serious harm in a country other than their own, who has not yet been legally recognised as a refugee and is awaiting a decision on the application for refugee status under relevant international and national instruments. In the EU context, the term refers to a third-country national or stateless person who has made an application for protection under the Geneva Refugee Convention and Protocol in respect of which a final decision has not yet been taken.¹¹

Migrant

There is no universally accepted definition for 'migrant'. The International Organization for Migration (IOM) defines it as an umbrella term, not defined under international law, reflecting the common lay understanding of a person who moves away from their place of usual residence, whether within a country or across an international border, temporarily or permanently, and for a variety of reasons.¹² These reasons may include forced displacement.

Person displaced from Ukraine

In the EU, the large majority of the persons fleeing the Russian war on Ukraine are not technically considered refugees or asylum seekers, as they are on residence permits based on the Temporary Protection Directive (TDP). Not all of them are Ukrainian nationals. In this report, we refer to them as 'persons displaced from Ukraine'. We use this term to refer to any person, regardless of their nationality, who has had to leave Ukraine and is unable to return in safe and durable conditions because of the Russian war of aggression against Ukraine.

Refugee

Refugees are defined and protected in international law. The primary and universal definition of a refugee is contained in the 1951 Refugee Convention, which defines a refugee as: "someone who is unable or unwilling to return to their country of origin owing to a well-founded fear of being persecuted for reasons of race, religion, nationality, membership of a particular social group, or political opinion."¹³
